

# Provider Tip & Activity Sheet

## Peek-a-boo Book

### INGREDIENTS:

Cardboard

Photos

Fabric squares

Glue

Hole puncher


Yarn

### INSTRUCTIONS:

- Cut pieces of cardboard in 8 inch square pieces
- Cut fabric into slightly smaller squares
- Attach a piece of fabric onto a piece of cardboard, creating a "peek-a-boo" flap
- Under each flap, glue a photo or picture
- Hole punch and tie together to use as a book - or keep them separate. You decide!
- This activity is great for babies, especially when they are establishing object permanence and showing signs of separation anxiety. Playing this game builds cognitive skill, fine motor control, and sense of self if you use photos of the baby!!
